here is an old hymn, it is in our books, that begins, "Peace, perfect peace, in this dark world of sin?"

I think maybe when we sing this line, and the first lines of the next five verses, we might miss the question mark! The lyricist is posing a question here.

Peace? Perfect peace? In this dark world of sin? How is that possible?

A careful study of scripture will show us that there are at least two aspects to the idea of peace.

The first is that we should, as far as is possible, live in peace with each other.

Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord (Hebrews 12:14).

The second is, of course, the peace that we receive from God. Which brings me neatly back to our hymn by Edward Bickersteth.

Peace, perfect peace -- in this dark world of sin? **The blood of Jesus whispers peace within**.

Peace, perfect peace -- by thronging duties pressed? **To do the will of Jesus, this is rest**.

Peace, perfect peace -- with sorrows

surging round? On Jesus' bosom naught but calm is found.

Peace, perfect peace -- with loved ones far away? In Jesus' keeping we are safe, and they.

Peace, perfect peace -- our future all unknown? -- Jesus we know, and He is on the throne.

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you (Isaiah 26:3).

Peace whatever is going on! Let me leave you with this.

Quiet minds cannot be perplexed or frightened but go on in fortune or misfortune at their own private pace, like a clock during a thunderstorm.
